



Do you recognise the man or this grave?

If you do, well done, if not you wont be alone. This is a picture of Nicholas Wood, one of the greatest mining and railway engineers of the industrial age. And this is his grave in Hetton churchyard.

He was a contemporary of George Stephenson and it was attribute to Wood that George Stephenson apprenticed his son Robert to him as a colliery engineer from 1819 to 1821 at Killingworth Colliery (pictured) in Northumberland. Nicholas Wood was involved in discussions leading to the Mines Inspections Act of 1851 and it was Woods' determination and persistence that helped to increase safety and reduce fatalities in mines. His residence Hetton Hall where he lived until his death in 1865 was sited

approximately where the old swimming baths stood. It is interesting to note that Hetton was once also home to Tommy Hepburn who founded the first miners' union.

Today, Nicholas wood is remembered as a founder member and the president of the North of England Institute of Mining and Mechanical Engineers where the magnificent library is named after him. A project is currently underway with some students to research the life and influence of Nicholas Wood thanks to funding from the Royal Society.

It is sad that this great man's grave is deteriorating and needs some restoration work. If anyone is willing to try and produce funds to restore it, please contact John Price on (0191) 553 6600.

A VERY IMPORTANT STEP

In June 2009 we saw a very important agreement set out between Sunderland City Council and Hetton Town Council.

Hetton has the only such first tier of local government in the city (where as our nearest neighbours in county Durham has more than 100 town and parish councils!.)

Therefore it is essential that all services and projects are highlighted and approached correctly for the extra benefit of Hetton's 16,000 residents.

The Labour government supported the drawing up of

formal chartered agreements and protocols between the parishes and principle councils.

At a special ceremony at Sunderland Civic Centre the formal signing of the charter between the Mayor of Hetton Councillor Mrs Marie Anderson, and Mayor of Sunderland Councillor Dennis Richardson (see photo) saw a great agreement in partnership working.
