Hetton Town Council this year are determined to banish the winter blues and light up the district with the Traditional Christmas Tree and Illuminations... and a special visit from Santa's Reindeers, Dancer and Prancer (Rudolph is in resting for the big night!)

On Friday 30th November from 6.00pm Christmas really begins and families can soak up free festive entertainment from 6.00pm at Barnard Park (opposite swimming baths) where a small funfair, choirs, music and children's entertainment will be available for all... together welcoming the arrival of Santa Claus, his sleigh and real live reindeer!

Then with a flick of the switch the Mayor of Hetton will light up the huge live Redwood Christmas Tree and the Town Centre Illuminations. The famous Redwood Tree was donated to the Town

If you would like your home to be judged, or wish to nominate another home, simply complete and return the attached slip to the Hetton Town Council Office at the Hetton Centre before November 30.



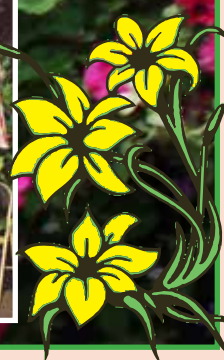
Hetton's Blooming Brilliant!

Hetton Town Council... in action!



People often ask what matters the Town Councillors are busy working on to benefit the Town and Community, each year members examine issues and carefully decide the best way to commit the council resources (no increase in council tax to the residents has been levied for five years, therefore funds are obviously at a premium)

Recent projects in 2012 are as follows:-

You said.....

- Many complaints were received regarding the practice of persons parking 'cars for sale' on public grass verges causing a nuisance.
- The Easington Lane Memorial Clock Tower and Hetton Memorial Cross are in need of cleaning and maintenance.
- We enjoy using the new seats and litter bins provided.
- Concern was expressed regarding traffic management issues on the B182 North Road
- Many local groups and community organisations need support and assistance with development.
- We want to see how the Town Council operates and have our say on matters.

We did.....

- At Four Lane Ends a flower bed and rockery were created to prevent this anti-social practice, and similar projects will follow.
- In partnership with the City Council, a specialist contractor carried out the necessary work in time for Remembrance Day Sunday Services.
- Hetton Town Council continued to fund a programme of renewing street furniture.
- In consultation with the residents the City Council, following a request of Hetton Town Council, have proposed a series of measures to reduce speeding traffic.
- Hetton Town Council continue to make a full range of Community Grant Awards to more than 30 local groups each year.
- At each Town Council meeting there is a formal allocated time of 15 minutes to allow public participation.



"BIKEABILITY" For everyone's safety.

All of us will be familiar with our schooldays and "the cycling proficiency test".

Well, things have moved on, but the city council road safety team still visits schools to advise and help cycling in safety and care on the road.

Many Hetton and District school children will soon be receiving their certificate of completion following the

safety training and as a special award.

Hetton Town Council has funded a series of presentations in schools where star pupils will be presented by the Mayor of Hetton with the prizes of Cycle Safety Helmets, lights and other necessary equipment, with a special "well done" from all.

The full formal meeting of the Town Council are now held in the Council Chamber, the Hetton Centre on the Third Monday of each month (except August) commencing at 7.15pm, and are open to the public.

Where possible (when not discussing items of a confidential issue), all sub-committees of the Council are also open to the public.

Have your say...

Hetton Town Councils monthly meetings (every third Monday of the month commencing at 7.15pm) include an official item on the Agenda, that of Public Participation, where residents can come along to the meeting to discuss agenda items and have their say on issues that affect them. The Mayor who controls the meetings will allow a designated time slot for the points to be made.

Items raised may be discussed immediately, or noted and discussed at a subsequent meeting. If there are minor issues raised, or matters that need urgent attention (for example street lights not working or litter problems), attendees can leave a short written note detailing the issue, and leave it with the Town Clerk for attention.
